Albany Youth Struck, Killed

REDDING, Calif. -- Michael A. Morris, 19, 924 W. Fifth Ave., Albany, Ore., a student at Shasta College here, was killed when struck early Sunday as he was walking on U.S. 99 south of Redding, the California Highway Patrol reported.

The auto was driven by Larry Schwegerl, 19, of Redding. Officers said the case was being investigated and would be taken under advisement by Shasta County District Attorney Richard Abbe today. In the meantime, Schwegerl was not cited. Officers said Mr. Morris was walking home from a college dance on the two-lane divided highway at the time of the accident.

Mr. Morris, who was born May 18, 1943, lived in Albany all his life and was graduated last year from Albany Union High School. He had just completed his freshmen year at Shasta College.

A member of the Westminster United Presbyterian Church and DeMolay, Mr. Morris is survived by his mother, Mrs. Velma Morris of Albany and father, Walter S. Morris, San Francisco, Calif. Also a brother, Robert S. Morris, Medford, and grandparents, Mrs. Edith L. Stone, Albany and H. C. Morris, Sarasota, Florida, survive.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Westminster Church here, with burial in Riverside Cemetery. Dr. Morton L. Booth, church pastor, will officiate at the funeral and arrangements are in charge of the Fisher Funeral Home.
