**Jerry C. Young**

Jerry C. Young, 68, of Umatilla died Monday in Richland, Wash., of complications from open heart surgery.

He was born in Spokane, Wash., to Ted and Ethel (Foote) Young.

He married Pat Bramble in 1957, in Cherryville. They latter divorced.

Jerry graduated from Sandy Union High School in 1955, and played on the Shriners All-Star Football team. In 1985, he was potentate for Al-Kader Shriner Temple in Portland.

He graduated from Montana State University in Missoula, Mont., and moved to Albany in 1960.

He taught and coached football until 1965, when he acquired the Kentucky Fried Chicken franchise and opened stored in Albany, throughout the valley and on the coast.

Jerry moved to Umatilla in the mid 1990s, and married Melody. He owned and operated Young's Orchards and Espresso with his wife, Melody.

He is survived by his wife, Melody; daughters Valorie Farmer of Tigard and Lisa Nielson of Medford; and four grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Ethel and Ted Young.
